

Recommended sites for AZ water information - FYI:

- New.azwater.gov; this is the ADWR site with a huge amount of information. Look at “Programs” to see AMA’s, Assured and Adequate Water, Drought, Colorado River, etc.
- Wrrc.arizona.edu: Water Resources Research Center at the University of Arizona. Colorado River, statewide water issues.
- Cap-az.com; Central Arizona Project news. Check the link to “knowyourwaternews.com”. Blogs about the Colorado River.
- *The Kyl Center for Water Policy at ASU, “The Myth of Safe-Yield”* about aquifer depletion, available on the internet.
- *Beyond the Mirage*, PBS Documentary on the Colorado River. Has a detailed review of desalination operations in Israel. Available from SCW Library and on You Tube.
- *Arid Empire: The Entangled Fates of Arizona and Arabia*, Natalie Kock, available in the SCW Library. A great research book about the settling of the Southwest, establishment of the U of A and the intertwined history of Arizona and Saudi Arabia and water.

Other sources of information about water issues in the world:

- *H2O, the Molecule that Made Us*, PBS Documentary – now available in Rec Center Library. Three episodes from earth’s creation up to today.
 - Groundwater is poorly managed everywhere.
 - Wet Areas are Getting Wetter and Dry Areas are getting Dryer.
- *The Green Desert*, PBS and CA Farm Water Coalition. “Food Grows where Water Flows.” Free on the internet.
- *Let There Be Water*, Seth M. Segal. A history of Israel’s approach to water use and conservation, available in the SCW library.
- *Running Out*, Lucas Bessire. A first hand history of the depletion of the huge Ogallala aquifer in the central US. Compare to Arizona aquifer management. Note that the depletion of the Ogallala aquifer is also mentioned in the documentary, “H2O, the Molecule that Made Us.” Available in the Rec Center library.
